Rummana Aslam, MD, is the Chief of the Division of Wound Care and Director Limb Preservation Program at Hackensack University Medical Center. She initiated the division and under her leadership it has grown into an academic division of excellence. She is board certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Brain Injury Medicine & Wound Medicine and Surgery.

She began a distinguished career in wound healing after attending residencies in Surgery and PM&R followed by a Research Wound Fellowship at the University of California San Francisco and Clinical Surgical Critical Care Fellowship at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. She served as an expert panel member in publishing the Wound Healing Society (WHS) guidelines for the prevention and treatment of

chronic ulcers. She has published widely and has been an invited speaker nationally and internationally. Her research focuses on the biochemistry of wound inflammation. She has established a unique wound fellowship and is a leader in developing education and curriculums in wound medicine for medical students, nurses, residents and junior faculty.

Dr. Aslam has received many recognition awards including “Young Investigator Award” WHS, “Excellence in Teaching Award” University of California School of Medicine, and “Innovator Award” New Jersey Inventors Hall of Fame.
